These meetings provided an opportunity to present the project to the tutors, who will be experimenting with the online resource space to enhance their skills.

A SURVEY OF TUTORS

A field survey was carried out in the two project countries: 80 questionnaires filled in by the tutors and 14 political and institutional players interviewed to highlight the main elements on which the tutors rely to support the young people. Based on this study, a reference framework of skills was drawn up for tutors supporting young people in exile.

A SKILLS FRAMEWORK FOR TUTORS

The tutors helped to draw up the reference framework. A tool for making their skills clear, it highlights four key skills on which the tutoring function is based to support young adults in exile. It includes taking into account the migratory journey, any traumas that may have occurred, and the challenges associated with inclusion in a new territory.
